70 Years of July 4 Celebrations: From the Beginning

It all started with a picnic:

"The March's youngest daughter was born on July 3, 1939, and the family used the occasion to hold a picnic that soon evolved into a Westmorland tradition. 'Around 50 Westmorlanders got together and had a picnic on the March lawn. That night Joe Wilson and Robert Barnwell shot off fireworks in one of the vacant lots on Paunack Avenue, then everyone congregated around a huge bonfire. The first large venture in community fellowship was a great success,' The Courier reported in 1952."

The March lawn was located at 4001 Toepfer Avenue, the oldest house in the Westmorland neighborhood. Otto Toepfer Jr. built the house in 1906 on the corner of Mineral Point Road and what was to become Toepfer Avenue. The Paunacks bought the house from the Toepfers in 1930, and the March family bought the house from the Paunacks in 1937.

Then someone decided to create a neighborhood association:

"On July 4th, 1940 the same group held a picnic in a vacant lot on Toepfer Avenue between Birch and Meyer Avenues. By the next July 4th, the festivities would be hosted by a newly minted Westmorland Community Association. *Continued on Page 3...*

Recent Car Break-ins

The neighborhood has seen another outbreak of opportunity thefts from cars. It appears that thieves are working at night by checking cars to see if they're unlocked and then take anything of value. Please don't make it easy for thieves by leaving valuables in your car and leaving your doors unlocked. Similarly, keep your house locked and garage doors closed to we don't give thieves easy access. Madison Police Dept. is aware of the outbreak and has promised extra patrols.

James March wanted to see a community association such as he had known in his hometown of Cleveland, Ohio. He convened a meeting of 10 people in his home on April 1, 1941 to discuss the formation of a community association to lead the effort for street improvements, landscaping public areas, development of play areas or parks, supervision of housing development, promotion of community services, and carrying out social activities in the neighborhood."

And what do you think the first order of business was for the new neighborhood association?

"The WCA's first project was the organization of a 4th of July celebration in 1941. The association rented a large circus tent and pitched it on a lot west of Toepfer Avenue between Birch and Euclid Avenues. Events included a children's parade, baseball games, horseshoes, and bingo. "

In fact, the neighborhood association even advertised the event.

"The WCA published its first newsletter in June 1941 to spread the word about the newly formed association, as well as details for the upcoming 4th of July picnic."

And the rest, as they say, is history.

"In May 1943, the Dane County Board voted to sell the 7.5-acre tract to the Town of Madison for a public park and playground for \$1,500. The fourth annual 4th of July picnic was held at the new park in 1944, starting with a bike parade down Westmorland Boulevard."

The July 4 celebration has been going strong for 70 years. Come join your neighbors, past and present, enjoying the day, hanging out, talking about Westmorland history, eating brats, and listening to V05. There will be surprises-it's the 70th after all-so come and find out why the Fourth of July has always been the cornerstone event in our neighborhood. A Long Slow Spring

The fits and starts of springtime were certainly a mental challenge for gardeners and other outdoor enthusiasts this year but it did slow down some plants, like garlic mustard, and gave us a chance to stay on top of them before they went to seed. We spent much of May at the Glenway bikepath intersection eradicating garlic mustard and some other weeds. There are not nearly so many as there were just a year or two ago and that certainly helps keep up our determination.

Si Widstrand, formerly with the Parks Department, is a dedicated retiree working on many parks and greenspaces in Madison and tirelessly lobbying the City for best practices. He emailed a timely succinct comment about The Dreaded Garlic Mustard the other day that I will share with you here: "I was looking at a management site in Elver Park today, 6 acres and it had one tiny patch of garlic mustard (which I pulled, and will check later). These NEW scattered individuals and small patches are where we can still make a big difference in slowing the spread of this nasty weed. Pull them this year, check a couple weeks later for stragglers, then check the same spot next year. Here's some info and a couple pictures: <http://dnr.wi.gov/invasives/fact/garlic.htm> SW"

In early May, Si spent several hours chainsawing trees and brush in the Rock Garden on Gately Terrace and all the way around through the lilac clumps and plantings near the tennis courts, while I hauled volumes of brush to the curb. He got so far ahead of me that it took half a dozen people at our Tuesday night work party to catch up with what remained, but what a difference! It all looks so much better and encouraged us to continue with pruning to get more elbow room for the good things there.

Although our concentration this year is on maintenance - pruning and weeding - we will be doing some replacement planting of shrubs and one mature maple tree in Westmorland Park near the Rock Garden with assistance from City Parks. These plantings may have taken place by the time this is published. Also, in the spirit of lower maintenance, the plantings around the Westmorland sign on Glen Drive was reduced in size and reorganized to take better advantage of the conditions there.

We are currently seeking a neighbor or two who would maintain a median on Westmorland Blvd between Paunack Ave and Euclid Ave. This isn't a

huge time sink but is a great opportunity for someone who needs the flexibility to work on greenspace on their own schedule. It primarily involves weeding about monthly in the summer and cutting plants down in fall. Please contact Kris Schoenbrunn at 233-4832 if you'd like more information. Training and assistance available from the Greenspace Crew if desired.


The Greenspace Crew meets each Tuesday evening in the summer from 6:30pm-8pm for a work party, followed by refreshments at the Village Bar. A couple of newcomers have joined our work parties this year. 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Page 6 **The Start of the West Madison Little League in Westmorland**

The origin of the West Madison Little League (WMLL) program has a Westmorland connection. In the late 1950's, major league baseball was the sport of choice for many in Wisconsin. Just a few years earlier in 1953, the Braves baseball team had moved from Boston to Milwaukee. In 1957 and 1958, the Braves were in the World Series and baseball fever was at its highest level in Wisconsin.

With this background, the idea of a Little League program on the Westside of Madison was born with Kenny Doyle, David Dumphy, Don King, and Pierce Nolan being among the early planners of the program. In 1959, the WMLL received its original charter from the national Little League, Inc. organization. The first season, in the summer of 1959, consisted of 60 boys, ages 9 through 12, playing on four teams with the names of the Kings, Jets, Colts, and Dukes. Games were played at the Midvale School play field on weekday evenings. The league boundaries were Randall Avenue on the east, Regent Street on the north, the Illinois Central RR tracks and Odana Road on the south, and Midvale Blvd. on the west.

In 1960, the league grew to six teams, named the Jets, Aces, Comets, Dukes, Colts, and Kings, and a total of 90 players. The league boundaries were extended to Park Street on the east, University Avenue on the north, the West Beltline on the south, and Gilbert Road on the west. Games that summer were played at the WMLL's own baseball diamond constructed by parents and players at the site of the current Midvale Heights Apartment building at 501 Midvale Blvd (constructed in 1963). Home plate was located next to the old Midvale Plaza shopping center (built in 1957 and opened for business in 1958) along Midvale Blvd. Left field backed up to Midvale School and the right field was along Caromar Drive. Robert, "Red", Wilson, former major league baseball player, and George Fabian, shoemaker, and the "Mayor of Park Street" were two of the coaches in the early years. Play continued at the Westmorland site during the summer of 1961 with six teams participating in the league. In the early years of the league, there were no players fees and the league provided minimal equipment for the players. Funds to support the league were raised by the players on "tag days".

Players, wearing their uniforms, would solicit donations at neighborhood stores and shopping areas. On Saturday mornings, parent volunteers would gather at the baseball field with their own lawn mowers to mow the grass on the field.

When the land where the field was located was sold in 1962, the WMLL moved to a new baseball field constructed between Hammersley Road and the West Beltline on a site later occupied by WISC, Channel 3, TV and currently occupied by the Pacific Cycle Company building. Games were played on this field in 1962 and 1963. Then in 1964, games were moved to another new baseball field on Forward Drive on land provided by WMTV, Channel 15, TV where the WMLL fields still exist today.

Currently, the WMLL consists of over 900 boys and girls, ages 8 through 16, on over 75 teams, playing on five different baseball and softball diamonds at the Forward Drive site. The WMLL program has indeed come a long way from its humble roots in Westmorland.

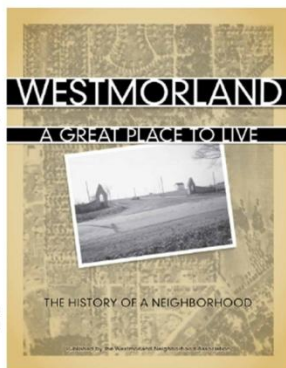

Preservation Jen

Dear Jen,
I have an original wood paneled screen door on the back of my house. While I love the look of the door, the paint is badly peeling and I am concerned about lead paint. Is there a way I can save my door safely or should I just replace it?
-confused in Westmorland

Dear confused in Westmorland,

I completely understand your love of old screen doors - they're great. Not only do they add character to our Westmorland homes, they sound good too, right? You most certainly should save your screen door. As you may know any paint applied before 1978 most likely contained lead. It is important to keep in mind that lead paint is only harmful when it is either chipping or airborne. Containing lead paint by encapsulation is an excellent way to maintain a safe home. There are a few key points to remember when scraping paint: Place a tarp under your work area. This will collect the paint chips from the door. When you are scraping, use a mist bottle while scraping, thus minimizing the paint dust. You should wear eye

protection and a dust mask while scraping or sanding the door. When you are finished with the scraping and sanding, use a damp cloth to wipe down the door. Dispose of all tarps, paint chips, dusk mask etc in a heavy garbage bag and dispose in your trash. You are now ready to repaint your wood screen door. These meals are co-sponsored by the West Madison Senior Coalition and the Dane County Area Agency on Aging.

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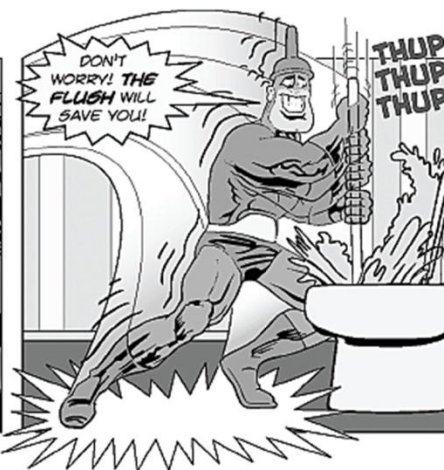

Home Sales - 2009, 2010 and 2011

There are fewer Westmorland homes on the market this year than last, in part due to last year's federal tax credit incentive. Those few homes on the market are getting offers quickly. The average days on the market is skewed because one of the five homes sold was on the market for 179 days, the others averaged 11 days. One home sold for more than list price - something rare since the market's high point in 2006. If you have a home to sell this year, this is the time to do it, as there are buyers looking for homes in our neighborhood!

Market Absorption Trend - Buyers, Sellers or Balanced Market

One way to identify whether a location is in a buyers, sellers, or balanced market is determining how many months of home supply is on the market in a given time frame. This is an estimate of how many months it will take to sell current inventory assuming no new listings enter the market. Keep in mind that our market is seasonal, peaking in the spring and summer. Real estate professionals use these guidelines nationally: more than 6 months is a buyers market, less than 6 months is a sellers market, 6 months is a balanced market.

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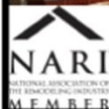
