Westmorland Park and Greenspace Anticipates 2011 Activities

Spring - so soon?! It seems like days ago that we were wrapping up our fall gardening activities and looking forward to the quiet of winter. While we've all endured the challenges of a snowy cold winter, mother nature has been at work in our greenspaces. Soon we will launch into caring for those spaces here in our neighborhood.

Our first major event of the year and one that usually brings a number of new faces will be: **Westmorland Park Cleanup/Earth Day Celebration on Saturday, April 16 from 9-12.** Meet at the Westmorland Park rock garden off Gately Terrace. If you can, bring your own tools. (leaf rake, garden rake, garden fork, shovel, wheelbarrow, clippers.

We will break into groups and gather trash from the rock garden and Tokay woodlands, rake leaves, trim plants/shrubs and perhaps spread mulch around some of the Park trees. Please join us for whatever length of time you can to help with this special day. Children are welcome and seem to enjoy gathering trash and plant clippings as well as helping to mulch. Refreshments for our workers.

In May, we will resume our weekly **Tuesday evening work parties** followed by a trip to the Village Bar for refreshments and friendship.

Each week we spend about 1-1/2 hours working together on a specific project area - weeding, planting, pruning, mulching, whatever needs doing. Much of our focus this year will be maintenance and projects that simplify our work, as in moving toward more native plantings and away from time and work consuming plants.

Glenway Bikepath plans

Late in the fall, we added lots of native seeds to this area. We will continue to work to eradicate invasives, particularly garlic mustard, reed canary grass, and thistle. With a little luck, our natives seeds from the past two years will take hold and begin to fill in the area allowing us to burn this site eventually (perhaps as early as this spring), which will both discourage non-natives and encourage the natives. Westmorland Woods (along Tokay Blvd)

We had a very successful work project last fall with Si Widstrand, retired Director of City Parks, eradicating a tremendous amount of invasives from the woodland beside the sledding hill. We have plans to meet with him again this spring for advice and perhaps another project day in the Westmorland Woods. Si is an inspiration as he moves quickly through a wooded area identifying invasives and problem species, chainsawing them or instructing others in work. It was a tremendously satisfying work day and I encourage anyone who is interested in helping with such an endeavor to contact us.

Rain Garden: We will focus on maintenance such as weeding and mulching. **Tokay Prairie:** We will continue to maintain this prairie possibly beginning with a spring burn. **Rock Garden:** Besides the annual weeding and pruning, The focus will be a gradual movement toward more low-maintenance plantings. This will include some serious pruning of the shrubs and hawthorne trees in this garden over the next few years as well as replacement plantings with native trees and shrubs. We will take this same approach with the shrub areas that lead from the rock garden past the tennis courts and up to St. Clair.

Call to Action!

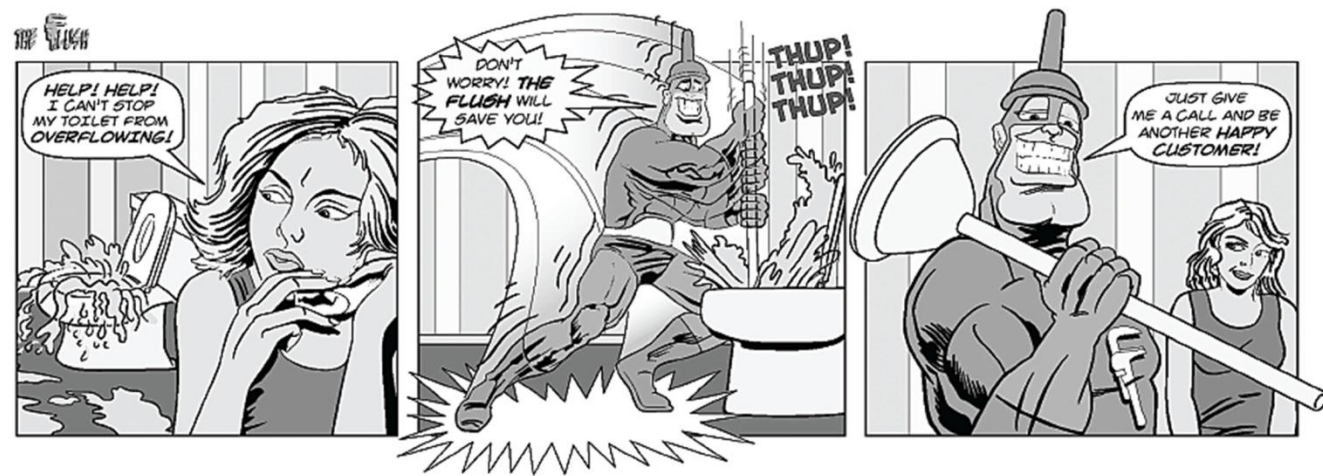

Market Absorption Trend - Buyers, Sellers or Balanced Market

One way to identify whether a location is in a buyers, sellers, or balanced market is determining how many months of home supply is on the market in a given time frame. This is an estimate of how many months it will take to sell current inventory assuming no new listings enter the market. Keep in mind that our market is seasonal, peaking in the spring and summer. Real estate professionals use these guidelines nationally: more than 6 months is a buyers market, less than 6 months is a sellers market, 6 months is a balanced market.
